- Write **at least 10 articles** from October 2025 to February 2026.
- Help future Erasmus students by sharing valuable tips and experiences about your host city.

Your articles can cover topics such as:

- **Finding accommodation:** platforms, tips, or personal experiences.
- **Best places to go out:** cafés, bars, clubs, or cultural events.
- **Getting around:** transportation advice and local hacks.
- **Cost of living:** budgeting tips for students.
- **Hidden gems:** must-see attractions, cultural spots, and more.

What are the benefits of being an ERASMUS Reporter?

- **Develop Your Skills:**
 - Participate in a **2-day event in Pavia, Italy (14-15 October 2025)** with professional journalists and media experts to develop your writing and storytelling skills.
 - Priority to take part in **garagErasmus events** across Europe during 2026 (based on your engagement).
- **Get Published:** See your work featured in an online magazine read by Erasmus students across Europe.
- **Build Your Network:** Connect with other Erasmus students and storytellers.
- **Recognition:** Earn a Certificate of Participation for your contribution.
- **Career Boost:** Gain the chance to obtain the **Italian journalism license** (*Albo dei Giornalisti*).

In case of equal evaluation, priority will be given to candidates who submitted their application earlier. Applicants are therefore strongly encouraged not to wait until the final deadline.
